And, I see quality crèches and pre-schools serving, in partnership, all organisations with sizable workforces.

The UAE's Vision 2021 comes of age that year, and my sense is that every aspect of that Vision will become a reality.

By being United in Responsibility, United in Destiny, United in Knowledge, and United in Prosperity, there is no doubt that the UAE will become a global benchmark for social and economic sustainability.

I see tangible world-class childcare development programmes proving their worth in enriching the lives of current and future generations.
